While faculty may expect that students have acquired information literacy and research skills from high school and some college courses, literature shows that many students have a marked overconfidence in their research skills. The Library's Instructional Services (IS) Team works with you to design instruction that helps students navigate Library resources and services, understand how information systems impact sources, and use discipline-specific resources in order to develop information literacy and research skills that can be applied directly to their assignments. 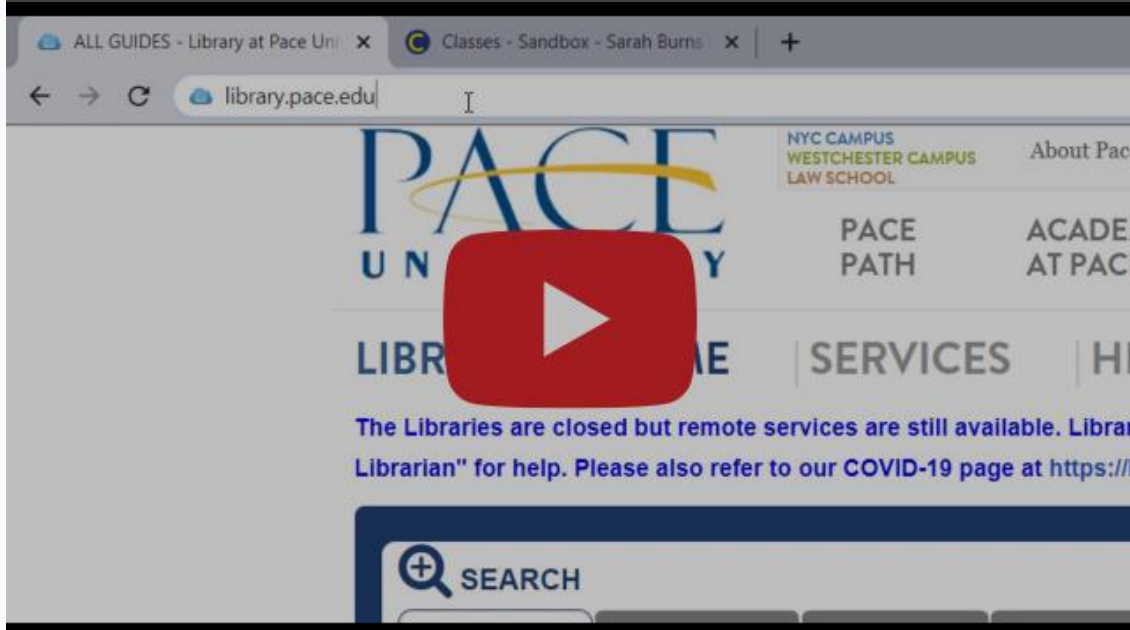
